Proverbs Lesson 12: Economic Well-Being
 How many of us consider ourselves economically wealthy? Does it depend on perspective? Jesus comments on the wealthy: Luke 18:18-25 (Story of the rich, young ruler.) Are we, as followers of Christ, supposed to sell all we have and give it away? What was the young ruler's core problem? (See Luke 16:13 & Luke 12:34)
The Proverbs have much to say about wealth. They examine what humanity's response is and what it should be to situations regarding wealth or lack thereof. Proverbs are not commandments or statements of absolute truths. Proverbs are general truths that if heeded will have a positive impact on life. Proverbs are guidelines for a life to be drawn closer to God. This lesson examines four aspects of the response to wealth: Personal gain: the right and the wrong way Perils of wealth to recognize and avoid. Impact of wealth or poverty on interpersonal relations. What we should do with our wealth. (All quotes in this handout are from the NKJV)
Ways of Gaining Wealth The proverbs suggest the correct path is indirect.
Prov 3:9-10 Honor the LORD with your possessions, and with the firstfruits of all your increase; so your barns will be filled with plenty, and your vats will overflow with new wine. Prov 10:4 He who has a slack hand becomes poor, but the hand of the diligent makes rich. Prov 11:25 The generous soul will be made rich, and he who waters will be watered himself. Prov 28:19 He who tills his land will have plenty of bread, but he who follows frivolity will have poverty enough!

Perils of the Rich		
Prov 11:4 Riches do not profit in the day of wrath, but righteousness delivers from death.		
Prov 11:28 He who trusts in his riches will fall, but the righteous will flourish like foliage.		
Prov 13:8 The ransom of a man's life is his riches, but the poor does not hear rebuke.		
Prov 18:11 The rich man's wealth is his strong city, and like a high wall in his own esteem.		
Prov 23:4-5 Do not overwork to be rich; because of your own understanding, cease! Will you set your eyes on that which is not? For riches certainly make themselves wings; They fly away like an eagle toward heaven.

Impact of wealth or poverty on interpersonal relations		
Prov 18:23 The poor man uses entreaties, but the rich answers roughly.		
Prov 19:4 Wealth makes many friends, but the poor is separated from his friend.		
Prov 19:6 Many entreat the favor of the nobility, and every man is a friend to one who gives gifts.		
Prov 19:7 All the brothers of the poor hate him; how much more do his friends go far from him! He may pursue them with words, yet they abandon him.		
Prov 22:7 The rich rules over the poor, and the borrower is servant to the lender.

Benevolence & Generosity	
Prov 3:27-28 Do not withhold good from those to whom it is due, when it is in the power of your hand to do so. Do not say to your neighbor, "Go, and come back, and tomorrow I will give it," when you have it with you.	
Prov 19:17 He who has pity on the poor lends to the LORD, and He will pay back what he has given.	
Prov 21:13 Whoever shuts his ears to the cry of the poor will also cry himself and not be heard.	
Prov 22:9 He who has a generous eye will be blessed, for he gives of his bread to the poor.	
Prov 28:27 He who gives to the poor will not lack, but he who hides his eyes will have many curses.
