#### LESSON 1

#### MATTHEW 1-2

### I. Chapter 3

Matthew introduces John's ministry by recounting his confrontation with the scribes and Pharisees. He then continues with Jesus' baptism by John.

#### • vv. 1 - 12

**Question 1.** In introducing John's ministry, Matthew cites to Isaiah's prophecy. v.3. What does Isaiah's prophecy in Isa. 40:1-2 indicate God would give Israel?

Question 2: To what prophet does Matthews description of John parallel in v. 4?

Question 3: What does John's ministry show is the spirit of kingdom citizens? vv. 2, 6.

**Question 4:** What does John's statement to the scribes and Pharisees indicate about the nature of the kingdom he is preparing people to enter? vv. 8-10.

**Question 5:** Based on Johns statement in v.11-12, what was to be Jesus' position in comparison to the scribes and Pharisees? See Isa. 4:4; Micah 3:2-3. In relation to Abraham, Moses and David who Matthew paralleled Jesus to in Ch. 1-2?

### • vv. 13-17

**Question 6:** What does the reason Jesus gives in v. 15 for receiving John's baptism establish will be a characteristic of his kingdom and his rule in that kingdom?

**Question 7:** Who is Jesus proclaimed to be in the event of his baptism and the Father's declaration? Ps. 4:7; Isaiah 42.

#### II. Chapter 4

Matthew presents the beginning of Jesus' own ministry. He beginsby presenting the Lord's temptation bu Satan in the wilderness.

#### vv. 1-11

**Question 8:** Who else fasted forty days and nights? Deut. 9:9: 1 Ki. 19:8? What may have been Matthew's purposes in relating this event? Matt. 17:1-13?

**Question 9:** What do you think each of Jesus' answers to the Devil explain about His nature as Messiah and the nature of His kingdom?

- v. 4 "But he answered, "It is written, "Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that comes from the mouth of God."
  - Deut. 8:3
- v. 7 "Jesus said to him, "Again it is written, 'You shall not put the Lord your God to the test."
  - Isa. 7:12
- v. 10 "Then Jesus said to him, "Be gone, Satan! For it is written, "You shall worship the Lord your God and him only shall you serve."
  - Deut. 6:3-15

**Question 10:** What promise is given to the citizens of the kingdom who follow Jesus' command? 1 Sam. 7:3.

**Question 11:** What will be the scope of Jesus' kingdom? 4:15-17. What is his first requirement for its citizens?

**Question 12:** How does the calling of the first disciples reflect what is required of kingdom citizens? vv. 20, 22.
