# Lesson 4: Jacob's Return to Canaan

## Reading: Genesis 31:1-33:20

In Chapters 29 and 30, Jacob arrives in Padam Aram and goes to a well where he meets Rachel, his future wife. He then meets her father Laban, Rebekah's brother. Laban welcomes Jacob into his home and asks Jacob what his wages shall be. Jacob requests the hand of Rachel in marriage for 7 years of service. Jacob soon realizes that Laban is deceptive as he replaces Rachel with her older sister, Leah, and Jacob must serve 7 more years in exchange for Rachel becoming his bride. During this time, Jacob is blessed with 11 sons and 1 daughter through Leah and Rachel who play out their competition for sons through their maid servants, Zilpah and Bilhah respectively. At the end of 14 years, Laban and Jacob agree to new set of wages where all the speckled and spotted sheep and brown lambs from Laban's flock will belong to Jacob. However, Laban again acts deceptively by initially removing Jacob's wages from the flock and giving them to his sons. Nevertheless, God continues to bless Jacob, and Laban's flocks continue to produce speckled and spotted sheep and brown lambs. Jacob also uses selective breeding techniques to ensure that the strong of the flock produce speckled and spotted, while the weak animals of the flock become Laban's. During this period of Jacob's life, God blesses him despite Laban's deception and even Jacob's own efforts to improve his situation. In this account, we are reminded of God's faithfulness to His people as He keeps the promises He made to Jacob at Bethel (28:13-15).
