# Abraham – A Character of Faith Hebrews 11:8-10, 17-19

**Lesson Application:** Faith grows not in the absence of struggles but in the midst of it—Abraham faced setbacks and successes in his life with God

- a. Difficult to pick up and leave homeland for an unknown place
- b. God's promises were great but he did not always understand when, how and why
- c. Some promises do not seem possible with the finite mind—ie. Bear a son when Sarah was 90 and Abraham was 100
- d. Being asked to offer his only son appeared to contradict the promise of "through your seed all nations of the earth would be blessed"

## Heb. 11:8-10; 11:17-19

- 1. Abraham's Faith-Heb. 11:8-10
  - a. When he was called, obeyed (vs. 8)
    - i. Went out to a place that God had promised as an inheritance
    - ii. Went out not knowing where he was going
  - b. Lived as an alien in the land of promise (vs. 9)
    - iii. As in a foreign land
    - iv. Dwelling in tents with Isaac and Jacob
    - v. Recognized that they had not yet inherited the land (would be for his descendants)
  - c. Looking for a city which has foundations (vs. 10)
    - vi. Whose architect and builder is God
    - vii. Based upon above point that his descendants had not yet inherited the land, he was looking beyond earthly land for an eternal home
  - d. When he was tested, offered up Isaac (vs. 17, 18)
    - viii. Received the promise of a son
    - ix. Offered up his only begotten son
    - x. Had been said, "through Isaac your descendants shall be called"

### 2. Promise to Abraham- Gen. 12:1-3

- a. A new land for his descendants- Canaan (vs. 1,7)
- b. A great nation- Israelites
- c. All families of earth would be blessed through his seed- Christ
- 3. Promise of a Son- Gen.15:1-7
  - a. Abram becomes discouraged because he is childless (vs. 2,3)
  - b. God reassures him, "descendants would number as the stars" (vs. 4,5)
  - c. Abram believes (vs. 6)
  - d. The Lord appears to Abraham as strangers telling him that Sarah will bear a son (Gen.18:10)

# 4. Obedient to God's Commandments Without Hesitation

- a. "Go to a new land that I will show you" Gen. 12:1, 4; Acts 7:3,4
  - i. Abraham departs with Sarah, Lot and all their possessions- Gen. 12:5
  - ii. Going to a land that he did not know-Gen. 12:1
- b. "Offer your only son"- Gen. 22:2-10
  - i. Rose early to go to land of Moriah (offer Isaac); Gen. 22:3

## 5. Love for God Above Love for Family

- a. Going to a new land unknown to him would have undoubtedly been hard for Sarah and Lot but he obeyed Gen.12:1,4-5
- b. Sacrificing his only son, Isaac, would have been very difficult given how hard it was for Sarah to conceive- Gen.22:1-2

## 6. Unselfish to Preserve Peace in Family- Gen. 13:6-12

- a. Land could not sustain herds and tents of Abraham and Lot (vs. 6)
- b. Abraham seeks to avoid strife (vs. 8)
- c. Gives Lot the choice of land versus him having first pick that would have been rightfully his (vs. 9)
- 7. Reverence to God Gen.17:3
- 8. Showed Hospitality to Strangers- Gen.18:1-8; Heb.13:2
  - a. Abraham hurried to make prepare for strangers
  - b. Sarah makes bread
  - c. Abraham has a servant prepare a choice calf
- 9. Compassion for Sparing Righteous if Found in Sodom & Gomorrah Gen. 18:22-33
