| 4) What is the "mind of Christ" as characterized in this passage?   |
| 5) What is involved in Christ's self-emptying? What does he surrender? Was this voluntary or involuntary?   |

| 6) What is the ultimate expression of Christ's selflessness and obedience? What are some ways in which Christ's humiliation illustrates Paul's exhortation verses 2-4? |
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| 7) What are the practical implications of the "self-emptying" mind for us? If we "empty ourselves," what will that mean in practical terms?                            |
| 8) What follows Christ's humiliation (2:9-11)? Does this have a counterpart in our case?   |
| 9) What Old Testament passage is used by Paul in verses 9 and 10? To whom does this refer in its original context? To whom does Paul refer this language?              |
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
