Lesson 8: Joseph's Brothers in Egypt

Reading: Genesis 42:1-44:34

In chapter 40, God continues to be with Joseph and causes everything he does to prosper, even in prison. As keeper of the prison, Joseph is charged with the care of the chief butler and chief baker, who have both offended Pharaoh. Each man has a dream but is unable to interpret it. Joseph interprets both dreams while giving credit to God. Both interpretations come true: in 3 days, the chief butler is restored to his former position as cupbearer to Pharaoh, and Pharaoh hangs the chief baker. In chapter 41, Pharaoh has two dreams. In the first dream, 7 lean, ugly cows eat 7 fat, healthy cows. In the second dream, 7 thin heads of grain eat 7 healthy heads of grain. When Pharaoh's magicians are unable to interpret the dreams, the chief butler remembers Joseph and tells Pharaoh of his ability. Joseph is brought before Pharaoh and states that God will give Pharaoh an "answer of peace". Joseph interprets the two dreams: there will be 7 years of plenty followed by 7 years of famine so severe that the plenty will be forgotten. Joseph recommends Pharaoh appoint someone to oversee the effort to collect 20% of the harvest during the 7 years of plenty to prepare the land for the famine. Pharaoh agrees and selects Joseph, acknowledging that he possesses the wisdom of God. As a result, Joseph is appointed prime minister over Egypt and is made second-in-command to Pharaoh. He is given an Egyptian name and an Egyptian wife and has two sons, Manasseh and Ephraim. When the 7 years of plenty ends and the famine comes, Joseph is put in charge of selling grain to the Egyptians and people from all other countries.
