Lesson 9: Joseph Reunited with his Family

Reading: Genesis 45:1-47:31

In chapter 42, with the famine having reached Canaan, Jacob sends his 10 sons to Egypt to buy food, while keeping Benjamin at home. When Joseph's brothers appear before him, they bow down fulfilling the dreams he had in Canaan. Joseph recognizes his brothers, but they do not recognize him. He accuses them of being spies, and in the course of defending themselves, they are required to prove their words by returning to Canaan and bringing Benjamin back with them. Simeon is held captive in exchange for the brothers' return with Benjamin. Joseph sends them back to Canaan with grain and their money returned in each of their sacks. During the event, Joseph's brothers believe these events are punishment by God for their treatment of Joseph. They return to Canaan and tell Jacob of the demands, but Jacob refuses to let Benjamin leave. Jacob finally relents and allows Benjamin to go to Egypt because they are out of food and Judah offers himself as surety for Benjamin's safety. When Joseph's brothers return to Egypt with Benjamin, they are invited to dine with Joseph, and Simeon is released. During the interactions with his brothers, Joseph finds a private place to weep. Joseph sends them back to Canaan with grain, their money returned in their sacks, and his silver cup in Benjamin's sack. He then sends his servant to catch up with them and accuse them of taking his silver cup. The brothers vow death to the one who has the cup, with the other brothers becoming slaves. When the silver cup is found in Benjamin's sack, they return to Egypt and appear before Joseph. When Joseph demands that Benjamin must stay as his slave and the other brothers can leave, Judah makes an impassioned plea on behalf of Benjamin and tells Joseph that if he does not personally return with Benjamin, then Jacob will die. Judah's defense establishes the scene where Joseph will reveal his true identity to his brothers.
