Lesson XI- Responsibilities of Children & their Fathers (6:1-4)/ Applications from Instructions to Servants & Masters (6:5-9)

Key Verse for the Epistle: "Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places in Christ" (Eph 1:3)

Paul continues to discuss familial relationships in the final chapter of the letter to the Ephesians beginning with a discussion of children obeying their parents. Children are told to obey their parents, while fathers are instructed not to provoke their children to wrath but bring them up in the Lord's nurture and admonition.

Paul also discusses the relationships that masters were to have with their servants while describing how servants were to act toward their masters. When masters and servants are seeking to do the will of God first, their actions toward each other will not be what the world would expect but rather guided by Christ and his love
